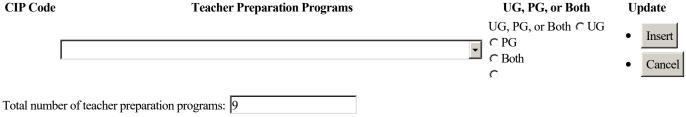

A large portion of schools in New Mexico serve limited English proficient students, and by way of their contract they have when they begin the program, they are most likely serving a primarily Hispanic population. We offer them supports to teach and reach these students in class, encouraging them to bring their daily classroom experiences to discussions. All of our alternative license students also take the methods courses in which they learn to make accommodations and adaptations for Special Education and for English Learners in the core academic subjects.
