In this book group, we will read and respond to the book, Becoming HSIs: Opportunities for Colleges & Universities by Gina Ann Garcia. Adapted from the cover:

Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs) are among the fastest-growing higher education segments in the United States. As HSIs increase in number, these questions bear consideration: What does it mean to serve Latinx students? All students at an HSI?



And what opportunities and challenges develop when a college or university becomes an HSI?

In Becoming Hispanic-Serving Institutions, Gina Ann Garcia explores how institutions are serving Latinx students, both through traditional and innovative approaches. Drawing on empirical data collected over two years at three HSIs and incorporating the voices of faculty, staff, and students, Garcia adopts a counternarrative approach to highlight the ways that HSIs are reframing what it means to serve Latinx college students.

Laura serves as Professor of Psychology and Chair of the Diversity Council and as a Fellow for the Teaching Academy, where she offers occasional panels and book discussion groups on provocative publications. She has been honored with several NMSU and Teaching Academy awards.
